About Calvary eAdmissions

Calvary eAdmissions replaces paper based hospital admissions forms. If online access is not possible for you, ask your hospital to provide you with a paper based form.

What are the benefits of online admission?

- Convenient and secure digital platform
- Removes errors in translating hand written information
- Removes the need to post or drop off paper forms at the hospital
- Faster subsequent admissions as most information can be pre-filled.

How long does it take?

- 15 to 45 minutes for your first online admission depending on the type of procedure and your health history
- Subsequent admissions are shorter – most of your information can be pre-filled from the first instance.

What do I need before I start?

- A mobile phone to receive confirmation SMS
- A digital device to complete forms on (eg. computer / tablet / smartphone)
- A unique email address for the patient to maintain privacy and confidentiality.
- Where applicable Medicare number / health fund / other compensation details
- Your health history information including height, weight, past surgeries and medications
- Name and contact details of your GP, Next of Kin and Power of Attorney.

When and how do I log on?

- As soon as the admission date is provided by your doctor visit the web address below to logon **<https://calvary.eadmissions.org.au>**
- Do not delay logging on, we require your information at least seven days before your admission
- First time users will be asked to create an account and set up a password.

What if I am interrupted or need to pause while I find more information?

- You may save a draft copy and simply login again to retrieve.
