Calvary Mater Newcastle is a public hospital within the Hunter New England Local Health District network.

About the service

Living with cancer can be a stressful time involving a range of emotional, social and psychological changes. Adjusting to these changes can be a huge challenge for people with cancer as well as those around them. Anxiety, depression, grief and heightened distress are common experiences, and can be difficult to manage.

The Psycho-Oncology Service at Calvary Mater Newcastle is a booked appointment outpatient service which provides a wide range of psychological interventions to help patients and their families adjust to or cope with their situation. The Psycho-Oncology Service is not an acute mental health service.

How can we help?

Asking for help can sometimes be hard. However, this service provides a confidential and supportive space to discuss your experiences, needs or concerns with the aim of building coping skills through evidenced-based strategies.

These strategies can include learning how to relax, manage negative thoughts and increase motivation and participation in life.

At the first meeting, the psychologist will speak with you about your situation, and treatment goals are developed together.

Our staff

The unit is staffed by clinical psychologists and psychiatrists who are fully registered and have post-graduate training.

As we are a teaching facility, there will also be medical or psychology students in the unit from time to time. If you are not comfortable having students involved in your care, please let a staff member know.
