

NSW Health Isolated Patients Travel and Accommodation Scheme (IPTAAS) is a subsidy scheme that financially assists people to access specialist medical treatment when it is not available in their local area.

You may be eligible for IPTAAS if you:

- Travel at least 100km (one way) from home to attend treatment
- Have travelled a total distance of 200km in one week from your usual place of residence to the treatment centre

Conditions apply.

Calvary Mater Newcastle is a public hospital within the Hunter New England Local Health District network.

Are you having outpatient treatment at Calvary Mater Newcastle?

If so, you'll need to arrange transport to and from the hospital. You should consult your family, friends, neighbours, your local church group or local club to see if they can assist you to organise to bring you to and from your treatment.

There are also community transport organisations available to assist you.

Community Transport

- Transport may be available by bus or private car.
- Fees for transport will be charged.
- Some organisations are unable to transport people more than two to three times a week.
- Some community transport organisations can only transport people between certain hours. Please inform the hospital staff when your appointments are being planned.
- Community transport needs at least one weeks notice of your transport requirement.
