



Turkish P&I cover issue resolved

Following significant engagement between the International Group of P&I Clubs (IG) and the Government of Turkey, an agreement has been reached allowing ships carrying crude oil cargoes to continue their voyages through Turkish-controlled waters.

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Members are referred to our [update](#) issued on 4 December 2022 regarding the Government of Turkey's requirement that ships carrying crude oil and transiting or entering Turkish waters from 1 December 2022 (extended to 2 December 2022) must provide letters of confirmation from the owner's P&I Club attesting that cover will remain in place while the ship is in Turkish waters.
